Ash Wednesday emphasizes a dual encounter: We confront our own mortality & confess our sin before God within the community of faith.

The use of ashes as a sign of mortality and repentance has a long history in Jewish and Christian worship, and the Imposition of Ashes can be a powerful nonverbal and experiential way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation.

<u>If you received a packet of ashes:</u> you may mix the ashes with a little bit of olive oil.

Do NOT mix ashes with water.

If you did not receive a packet of ashes: Write a particular sin or hurtful or unjust characteristic on a small piece of paper. The paper may then be burned instead of the palm branches traditionally used for the ashes. You may also choose to simply use olive oil to trace a cross on your forehead or hand.
