I look forward to my first Advent and Christmas here at FBC and the joyous music we will make together in the weeks and months ahead.



GIVING AND DOING

FBC has been hard at work for the Kingdom of God! The missions committee and WMU have been busy spreading the love of Christ through many missions' projects. The generosity of the FBC congregation has made these missions opportunities possible.

Through your generosity, FBC met our goal for the Alma Hunt Offering for Virginia Missions. We raised \$2,200. Together with many other Virginia Baptists our gifts help share the love of Christ across the Commonwealth of Virginia and with the whole world.







For October, WMU sponsored a churchwide mission opportunity with the Henry County Baptist Association to donate snacks and cookies for the hospitality tent at the fall race.

FBC also worked the Grace Network Pumpkin Patch to raise funds for our mission partner Grace Network.

At the end of October, FBC and our sister Church, Chatham Heights Baptist Church, hosted a Harvest Fest for children and families in our community. Activities included games, crafts, trunk n' treat, and live music. The missions committee contributed over \$1,000 towards this mission outreach project. We thank all the volunteers who helped make this community outreach mission's project a success.

In October, the missions committee contributed \$200 to the Good News Jail and Prison Ministry for

the annual Celebration Banquet, a fundraiser event for the Jail ministry. The Missions committee also contributed \$1,000 to the Good News Jail & Prison Ministry to be used as needed as it continues to bring hope to the incarcerated.

We continue to support missions in our community: In November, we will host a COVID Vaccine Clinic/Health Fair in our parking lot with the WMU Virginia, Baptist Nursing Fellowship, and Martinsville-Henry County Coalition for Health and Wellness. We will also be filling food boxes at the Henry County Food Pantry, sponsoring the "Fall" into Winter Fest Uptown, and more!

Young Families Sinkland Farms Trip


Our Young Adult Small Group, Journey, held a potluck fellowship dinner at the pastor's house, enjoying the company of friends and eating a shared meal together.
