THE BEAUTY OF THE SEASON(S)

Worship services at First Baptist are always thoughtful, Spirit-filled moments, but the worship services in November-January have been extra special. From the baptism of our Early Learning Center Director Beth Kotchish on November 22nd to the Choir Cantata December 18th to the special speaker who came at the end of January, we have seen God's hand at work among us in the Sanctuary of worship.

In just three months, we have experienced four different seasons of the church year. You see, the church year, during the Season after Pentecost, ends with Christ the King Sunday (usually around Thanksgiving;







this year, we concluded the church year on Sunday, November 22nd, the day of Beth's baptism).

Then the church year begins anew with the season of Advent (usually just after Thanksgiving), a time to prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ at Christmas. For four weeks, we light the Advent wreath candles of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. This year for Advent, different ministries of the church lit our Advent candles: Adult Sunday School, FBC Kids, Missions/WMU, and our FBC Music Ministry.

Then on Christmas Eve, we light the Christ candle, to signify that the miracle of the incarnation has arrived—Jesus is born! We celebrate Christmas/Christmastide until January 6th.

This year, we also had a special morning of Christmas Day worship, as Christmas fell on a Sunday. Between Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, we hosted not just our church family, but their families, and guests from our local area and around the country.

Heading into January, we celebrate the season of Epiphany, beginning with the arrival of the magi to the child Jesus, and walking through Jesus's life and ministry together.

This year, at the end of January, we shared in an Epiphany blessing by hosting the Executive Coordinator of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship Global, Rev. Dr. Paul Baxley, in our pulpit. His message of challenge from Jesus's Sermon on the Mount was a gift to us and to our sister church, Chatham Heights Baptist Church, that Sunday morning.

If you've not been to worship in awhile, I can only say: I highly recommend worshiping with First Baptist Church.

JOINING GOD'S MISSION IN THE WORLD

FBC Missions Committee and Woman's Missionary Union (WMU) helped to encourage our church family to reach the world with the love of Christ.

Henry Co. Food Pantry Food Box Packing

On November 12th, a team of FBC members (and friends!) packed over 100 food boxes for our neighbors in need and sorted many boxes of clothing for the clothes closet at the Henry County Food Pantry.

During December, WMU sponsored a churchwide mission project to fill shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child. FBC members filled 26 shoeboxes for children around the world.

In December FBC Missions & WMU also sponsored the Heifer International offering, and the church gave \$1,868.24 to provide water, education, and farm animals to communities in need.

The FBC Missions Committee reached out financially, too, contributing \$950 to the MHC Warming Center, \$250 to the Salvation Army Angel

Tree Program, \$400 to the American Red Cross, and \$200 to the Mulberry Creek Assisted Living community Christmas Store. FBC WMU also collected monetary donations for the Red Kettle Campaign in the amount of \$775.

FBC also participated in a community outreach event, "Fall" into Winter Fest in early December. The Committee contributed money for supplies

This Missions Committee also partnered our church with Good News Jail & Prison Ministry Chaplain Joe Collins to provide Christmas cards for the

corrections officers.

For the 38th year in a row, FBC hosted Richard's Dinner on Christmas Day in our Fellowship Hall so no one would be alone for Christmas Dinner, and FBC Missions pledged \$500 to support the event (in addition to providing our facilities).

Last, FBC WMU members made fleece-fringe pillows for at-home members. Members also prepared Thanksgiving cards for at-home members!
