As we continue to work through our shared goals in ReShaping our ministries, I really believe that we will see the springtime of our ministry—new growth, new life, and new hope for what it means to be the people of God who meet at the corner of Starling and Mulberry.

### HOLY SEASONS: LENT & EASTER AT FBC

The seasons of Lent and Easter are filled with symbols of our faith—from the symbol of ashes we don on Ash Wednesday, reminding us of our mortality and belovedness, to the palms of Palm Sunday, the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday, the Cross on Good Friday, and the empty tomb and new life of lilies and other flowers on Easter Sunday morning.



On Palm Sunday, we reenacted Jesus's triumphal entry with the waving of palms. We also had a special covenant signing ceremony with our CBF Field Personnel as we became a CBF Encourager Church.

During Holy Week, we shared services with our sister church, Chatham Heights Baptist Church. On Maundy



Thursday, we worshiped in the FBC Sanctuary, partaking in communion and a service of water and towel to remember Jesus's final meal with his disciples. On Good Friday, we worshiped in the Chatham Heights Baptist sanctuary, walking through the stations of the cross and remembering the crucifixion in word, image, and song.



Easter was a beautiful Sunday at FBC, beginning with an Early Service in the Fellowship Hall, followed by a breakfast hosted by our Deacons. At the 11:00 a.m. service, we hosted guest musicians and retold the Easter story for children and adults alike, remembering the empty tomb and the first preacher of the resurrection in our Gospel lesson—Mary Magdalene!

Parent-Child-Church Dedication
service: Adalyn Grace White (4)

covenanted with their mother,

We were fortunate to have discussions with Jessica in Sunday School on April 2 and with Karen at a potluck supper, April 12. We are greatly looking forward to supporting these two dedicated servants. The committee would like to thank our great congregation for their support—the potluck supper was outstanding because of you.

We will continue to serve the Henry County Food Pantry by packing food boxes and sorting clothes. Our next date is June 10, 10AM-12PM in
