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#### SWEET SUMMERTIME

One way was our hosting the Interfaith Dialogue, organized by the Interfaith Council of Martinsville/Henry County. As a panelist, I got to speak to how interfaith dialogue can create a more cooperative community, alongside guest speakers from the Jewish and Muslim faith traditions. Our church historically has been committed to ecumenical and interfaith partnerships, and it was a joy to reconnect in person with this great group!



I also got to join with like-minded Baptists from around the world at the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship (CBF) General Assembly, where we were invited to pursue "Holy Ambition" by equipping ourselves to put our faith into action through learning, encouragement, and challenge.

At the final worship service, we commissioned new Field Personnel as well as 29 CBF-endorsed chaplains and pastoral counselors to serve in various settings—from the military to hospitals to private counselors and more.

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#### PENTECOST: A BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION!

At the end of May, our church celebrated a big birthday—the birthday of the Church! The celebration of Pentecost remembers when the Holy Spirit (symbolized as fire in Acts 2) was given to the disciples and all believers, thus giving birth to the church. We celebrated by wearing the colors of fire, reading the Pentecost story from Acts 2, and hearing the scriptures read in various languages.

Our children colored their own flame and made it into a headband, symbolizing the flames that rested upon the disciples who spoke in different languages from around the known world so everyone could understand.



After Pentecost Sunday, we entered the season after Pentecost, also known as "ordinary time," a season in the church year lasting 24 weeks, to celebrate the church and the church's mission in the world. The liturgical color is green, symbolic of the church's growth and mission. I'm reminded of how our children embody our growth, watching them

in worship, learning the Lord's prayer, holding hymnals and learning the songs of the faith, and even pretending to be pastor by borrowing my stole!

In worship, we also had Caroline Tucker presented in view of a call on June 11, and the

church called itself into business to vote afterward, affirming her call and her new position to begin on July 23. That first Sunday was a joyous occasion, celebrating our continued partnership with



Chatham Heights Baptist Church for Kingdom work!

## Missions

On June 10, the missions committee had planned a food packing event at the Henry County Food Pantry; however, just before the event, the Food Pantry informed us that there was a food shortage and that they did not have enough food for an event that month. Our committee voted to send \$1,000 from missions opportunity funds to help with food costs, but we know the need and the cost of food are both very high. We will continue to partner with the food pantry and offer help by sorting clothes for the clothes closet, packing food as they have it, and providing money as they need it.

In July, the Missions Committee entered our church into partnership with Patrick Henry Elementary School to provide extra food to children over the weekend who are experiencing food insecurity at home. We have provided money to buy food to stock the pantry initially, and we have invited our church and ELC families to donate to the pantry with specific food items requested throughout the school year. Summer is a busy time for us here at First Baptist. Lots of exciting things have been going on this summer!


Teacher Appreciation Week was May 8-12, and our teachers received a gift card and a personal thank you from our FBC Personnel Committee.

Graduation was Friday, June 2 for our Pre-K4 class. Seven children graduated, and three of these children begin Kindergarten this month. After Graduation, the ELC hosted the Second Annual Art Show to benefit the Missions Opportunity Fund from the proceeds and we were able to contribute \$82.00 to the Fund. Our 2-year-olds held an Art Show on July 21 and collected another \$82.00 for the Fund.
