Today is the Fourth Sunday After Epiphany in the Christian year.

Epiphany (January 6) celebrates the manifestation of God in Jesus Christ. The Season of Epiphany continues this emphasis, calling attention to the words and deeds of Jesus' earthly ministry. The liturgical color for the season is green, representing new life and growth.

This year, during the season of Epiphany, we are seeking to know God better through a sermon series called "Epiphanies about God," reading from the Psalms each week. We are asking questions and seek answers with the psalmists about who God is, how God works, and how we might encounter God in our own lives.

New Christmas Trees

Each tree will cost \$799 for a total of \$2,397. **To date**: 1 ½ Trees donated.
